


Designed by William J. Spear, ASGCA, and opened for play in 1974, Palmer Hills Golf Course in Bettendorf, Iowa is a par-71 course. Featuring 100-year-old oak trees, rolling hills, meticulously maintained fairways, and a meandering creek that comes into play on 11 holes, the course offers a challenge and a beautiful setting for golfers of all levels.



Two ponds add to the picturesque landscape.



For the 11th year in a row, locals have voted Palmer Hills "Best Golf Course" in the Locals Love Us poll.



Palmer Hills also received the Quad Cities Business Journal's Best of the Region award in 2023.



Facilities and Amenities


Clubhouse



The current Palmer Hills Clubhouse, built in 2006, serves as the main facility for golfers and visitors, offering various services and amenities to enhance their experience. The Clubhouse includes the Pro Shop, Palmer Grill, and the Outdoor Patio.

Pro Shop

The pro shop is stocked with golfing equipment, apparel, and accessories. It provides a range of products for golfers of all levels.



Palmer Grill



The Palmer Grill is a bar and restaurant accommodating golfers and the public. The Palmer Grill provides a wide variety of delicious options for lunch and dinner.



The Palmer Grill provides catering for banquets and large parties and may be reserved for social events by the public.

There are also quick food options for players making the turn. The golf course has spectacular views from inside the restaurant or on the deck.



Outdoor Patio



An outdoor patio area offers a relaxing spot to enjoy the scenic views of the golf course. Customers enjoy drinks and live music on weekend evenings in the patio area.



Pavilion

The Pavilion is a covered outside area with a grill and picnic tables. The Pavilion is near the upper parking lot, making it an accessible facility. The Pavilion can accommodate up to 150 guests, making it suitable for large gatherings.



Catering services are available from the Palmer Grill. The staff assists in planning and executing the catering to meet specific preferences.

Practice Facilities

Putting Greens



There are two Practice Putting Greens located near the clubhouse. One is near the 1st tee, especially convenient for those starting their round. The 2nd one is near the lower parking lot and is more convenient for those using the Driving Range, or those wanting to work on their game.

The greens are maintained to mimic the conditions of the course greens, providing a realistic practice environment. They are maintained to the same high standards as the course itself.



Both Practice Putting Greens are big enough to allow multiple players to practice a variety of putts or chips.

Driving Range



The driving range features 30 tees, providing ample space for multiple golfers to practice simultaneously. The surface is all-season artificial mats.

There are three target greens and a big target net for short-game practice. There are yardage signs near the tees to allow the golfers to choose the proper club for a target.



The driving range has lighting to make it possible for golfers to practice in the evening when the days are shorter.

The driving range is designed to accommodate golfers of all skill levels, offering a comprehensive practice environment to work on driving, fairway woods, hybrids, long irons, and wedges.

Short Game Practice Area

The Short Game Practice Area is located near the maintenance facility. The Short Game Practice Area was installed for the high school golf teams to practice; it is available to the public when not being used by a team. Carts are available for free for players wanting to use the practice area.

The Short Game Practice Area is a dedicated area for practicing wedge shots from various distances. A sand trap makes this area ideal for practicing all types of wedge shots.



The Forge at Palmer Hills

The Forge is an 18-hole putting course. The course covers 56,500 square feet and has four putting greens, providing flexibility in setup. Each green contains multiple holes, which are routed out and back. Tees (Cup holder stands) and holes are moved routinely to reduce wear. The greens are bent grass and roll around 11 on a Stimpmeter, which is the same speed as the main course.





18-hole rounds at the Forge take between 45 minutes and an hour for most groups. The course is accessible to all skill levels but is still challenging for the best golfers.



The Forge includes a building where customers pay for their rounds. The building also includes a concession stand, which is conveniently located between holes 12 and 13.



The Forge can be rented out for birthday parties, corporate gatherings, and special occasions.

Other Facility Features

Tree Health and Tree Nursery

Bob Sartor is a volunteer and a resident tree expert. Bob developed software to map and list every tree on public ground in the City of Bettendorf. This software keeps our tree inventory updated on removed trees, planted trees, and the condition of the trees.

Bob also treats all ash trees on public land in Bettendorf, including those on Palmer Hills Golf Course. The course has not lost any ash trees to the Emerald Ash Borer due to Bob's work.

Bob is also on the City of Bettendorf Trees R Us committee which gives recommendations to the Parks and Recreation Department on tree management. Palmer Hills Golf Course has worked closely with the committee and Bob to plant over 250 native trees in the tree nursery.



The trees grow for 4-5 years in the nursery before they are moved to the golf course. The Trees R Us committee has also purchased trees for immediate use at Palmer Hills such as replacement trees on #9 hillside by the tee boxes to replace pine trees that have died.

Vegetable Garden



A 2,400-square-foot fruit and vegetable garden was installed in 2017 behind the 7th green and adjacent to the 8th tee box. An 8-foot-high fence lined on the exterior with rabbit guard, buried about a foot into the ground protects the garden from rodents.

2024 marks the 2^{nd} year the Palmer Hills Garden is partnering with <u>Tapestry Farms</u> to grow cabbage. Tapestry Farms planted approximately 400 cabbages in April and a 2^{nd} batch of 300 cabbages in June.



Tapestry Farms is a nonprofit urban farm system, welcoming the Quad-Cities refugees. They nourish people and land, in hopes that all in the Quad-Cities community will be abundantly fed.

The cabbages are distributed to food pantries in the Quad Cities area through the Local Food Purchasing Agreement, an initiative that compensates primarily socially disadvantaged farmers' market rate for produce grown for people with limited resources.

Landscaping



Paul Marietta is a volunteer who has donated one day per week to maintaining landscape beds and developing new beds. Paul plants perennial flowering plants and helps maintain and harvest the garden vegetables. He has also built birdhouses to attract Bluebirds and Purple Martins to the golf course.

Junior Golf



First Tee

In 2024 Palmer Hill and the Palmer Hills staff created a partnership. There have been several First Tee events at Palmer Hills. In 2024 220 kids went through the First Tee program at Palmer Hills.





Youth on Course



Palmer Hills and the IGA work together to allow the Youth on Course participants to play at a reduced rate. Flyers are on the Pro Shop counter to promote the program and the \$5/round rate. All Junior Program participants get one of the flyers.

PGA Jr. League



Butch Haverland, PGA Teaching Professional coordinates a PGA Jr. League at Palmer Hills. PGA Jr. Leagues brings family and friends together around fun, team golf experiences with expert coaching from PGA and LPGA Professionals.

Boys and girls of all backgrounds and skill levels learn and play golf together in numbered jerseys, utilizing a supportive, two-person scramble format that encourages mentorship, builds confidence, and promotes sportsmanship.

The Palmer Panthers participate in the PGA Junior League. There are 12 players on the team.

The league includes 5 lessons that cover all facets of the game of golf.

Wednesday Ladies Beginner League

Community Facility

First Green



Each year since 2018, Maintenance Superintendent Brian Hickey worked with Bettendorf Middle School to organize a field trip to Palmer Hills. At the course, Bettendorf eighth graders learn the science behind golf course management through a program called First Green. In 2023, more than 300 Bettendorf eighth graders participated in First Green.



The First Green is an outreach program of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. First Green is a science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM) environmental program that uses the golf course as a living laboratory. The students participate in hands-on, outdoor learning stations that include lessons on wildlife habitat, soil science, environmental sustainability, mathematics, water conservation, and water quality.



First Green gets students to the course that have never been there before. The students learn some golf course etiquette from a Bettendorf High School golf coach. The students also get a chance to do some putting. The hope is to get some new golfers from the group of students that come on the field trip.



Golf courses are sometimes portrayed as being bad for the environment. The First Green program gets the students to the course to hear about the environmental sustainability practices that are used at Palmer Hills.

Cross Country Skiing



When the golf course is closed to golfers, if there is sufficient snow, Palmer Hills transforms into a cross-country skiing venue. The trails are groomed regularly to ensure good skiing conditions.



The trails wind through the scenic golf course, offering picturesque views and a peaceful environment for skiing enthusiasts. The course features several trails that vary in difficulty, catering to both beginners and more experienced skiers. Specific trail lengths and difficulty levels may vary depending on snow conditions and course conditions.



The cross-country skiing trails are open to the public. Equipment rental is available in the clubhouse.

Great-Horned Owl Rehabilitation

In 2016, a Great-Horned Owl got caught in some ropes around a new tee box. The maintenance staff rescued the owl. The owl was injured, so the staff contacted someone to rehabilitate the owl. Owls are very territorial, so after the owl had recovered, it was released on the golf course.



4th of July Fireworks Viewing



Palmer Hills Golf Course closes early on the 4th of July. The golf course is a popular location to view the fireworks provided by the city of Bettendorf.

The parking lot and the amenities help draw people hours before the fireworks show starts. The driving range and the Forge are activities people can do after staking out their viewing location.

Commitment to a Positive On-Course Experience:

Play it Forward

Palmer Hills encourages players to Tee it Forward to increase the pace of play and improve the enjoyment of the golfers. The scorecard lists the suggested tee based on how far a player can hit their driver. The suggested tees are also listed on a sign just outside the clubhouse near where the carts are staged.



Course Conditioning



Palmer Hills Maintenance Superintendent, Brian Hickey, has a degree in turf management from Iowa State University and has earned awards from national greenkeepers' associations. Brian has diverse course maintenance experience across the country, including 13 years in Oregon.

Brian has been the Palmer Hills Maintenance Superintendent since July 2014. He was tasked by City Administrator Decker Ploehn with making changes to the course to appeal to a broader range of players while maintaining the course as a challenge to the best players.



The greens are maintained on an almost daily basis. The greens are mowed on some days and rolled on others. In some cases, the greens are mowed and rolled.






Brian has also implemented regenerative turfgrass management. This approach reduces the reliance on chemicals while promoting soil health. It also reduces the maintenance practices that affect the turf conditions for the golfers.

Brian has reduced fungicide applications. For the first few seasons that Brian was at Palmer Hills, there were 18 applications of fungicides. There are now about eight fungicide applications a year.

When Brian started at Palmer Hills, the course was "cart path only" for as many as four days after a significant rain. Because of regenerative turfgrass management practices and drain tile installation, there has been a reduction in downtime after rain events. Now the "cart path only" usually lasts about a day, depending on the amount of rain at the course.





The practices Brian has implemented at Palmer Hills have led to reductions in fertilizer and labor costs. The conditions at Palmer Hills are as good as they have ever been. The staff often gets complimented on the conditions of the course.

Continuous Improvement

The Bettendorf Parks and Recreation Department has developed a long-term plan for improvements to Palmer Hills. The plan is updated as new information becomes available. The City of Bettendorf supports the long-term plan by budgeting the improvements on an annual basis. In 2024, there is \$400,000 in the budget to:

- expand and repave the entrance drive.
- repave the parking lots.
- start the on-course restroom facilities improvement project.





Some of the long-term plan items that have been implemented are:

• The addition of new tees to cater to a wide variety of skills. In some cases, forward tees have been moved closer to the hole. In other cases, tees have been installed behind the existing tees to lengthen the course.





- Putting green installed near the 1st tee.
- Nets are installed on two sides of the driving range.
- Trees were also removed to widen fairways and improve fairway growing conditions. Cottonwood and Maple trees have been removed where they were impacting course conditions.

 Bunkers have been renovated to improve drainage and consistency of the sand. Some bunkers have been added to improve the aesthetics of the course and to make players reconsider their strategy.







• In 2018, a new 13th hole was created to make room for the Forge and to eliminate a blind shot from the tee on the 14th hole. The new par 3 has 2 bunkers, a two-tiered green, and a runoff area behind the green. This is a hole that golfers who are new to Palmer Hills Golf Course will remember after their round.





Some of the long term-plan items that are in the planning phase are:

- A six-hole Chip and Putt course.
- Add a pond and remove the creek between the third and fourth holes.

Walking Golf



Approximately 12% of rounds are walking rounds.

Palmer Hills offers pushcart rental for \$3. New push carts are added each year as older ones get retired.



Palmer Hills has Club Car Tempo Walk electric carts with GPS. The cart is hands-free for the golfer and has a cooler for beverages.

Palmer Grill offers a variety of delicious food and beverage options for everyone with spectacular views of the golf course whether you are dining inside or outside on the deck. Palmer Grill is available for large parties inside or outside under the pavilion.

Another unique element of Palmer Hills is the Palmer Hills Garden where they grow vegetables, including hundreds of cabbage for a nonprofit called Tapestry Farms that provides food for refugees in our area. 2024 is the second year of this partnership and already this year alone there have been 400 cabbage harvested from the Palmer Hills Garden.

Next year is the 50th Anniversary of Palmer Hills Golf Course! During this time, Palmer Hills has had only three Golf Professionals, Dick Keith, George Henry, and Jon Waddell and three Superintendents, Brad Peterson, Tim Johannsen, and Brian Hickey. Jon and Brian have been leading Palmer Hills since 1997 and 2014, respectively.

Palmer Hills has won several awards: Quad Cities Regional Business Journal Best of the Region Award for Best Golf Course, Quad Cities Area Locals Love Us #1 Golf Course (10 years in a row!), and Readers Choice Award Best Golf Course, just to name a few.

Palmer Hills Golf Course is not just a city amenity, it's a community amenity. People from across our area, region, and the Midwest visit Palmer Hills and can't wait to visit again which is evident by the great reviews Palmer Hills receives (see attached reviews).

I may be in a unique position to provide this letter of support. I am the third ward council member for the City of Bettendorf. In that position, I know firsthand the budgetary support the City makes to ensure that the course is exceptionally well maintained. Both in funding operational expenditures, and in providing ongoing capital expenditure support, Palmer Hills Golf course receives the support necessary to make and keep the course in ideal condition.

But the facility is more than just an 18 hole golf course. The Forge, an 18 hole putting facility, provides an important adjunct to the course, enabling those who, for whatever reason, cannot spend the time to play a full round an opportunity to work on putting, and to spend quality time with family and friends in a relaxed social experience. Other practice areas include a driving range, and a 40 yard chipping area. Palmer Hills provides a complete golf experience.

The facility also hosts a dining aspect, Palmer Hills Grill. Perfect for the after round soda or cocktail, or even the "dog at the turn," the grill gives golfers and non-golfers alike a place to eat, socialize, or just watch the players tee off or hit into the number 12 green.

As I said, I may be in a unique position to support this application, as I also am a season pass holder at Palmer Hills. Last year I played over 130 rounds there. I also play at most of the other area courses within a 45 mile radius. To me there is no question that Palmer Hills is one of the best maintained courses in my area. Last year the course had over 40,000 rounds, yet you could not tell it. Fairways and greens show little wear despite the play.

And the reason for such play is the fact that the course caters to golfers of all abilities. Senior and less skilled players happily use the up tees, allowing them to play a course set to their level; while the more skilled players have tees with plenty of distance to challenge their skills as well.

In short, Palmer Hills strikes the right balance of playability, accessibility, fun and challenge. Add the superb maintenance and you have a course which is a highlight in the community, highly supported, and deserving of your recognition.

I would like to nominate Palmer Hills Golf Course in Bettendorf, Iowa for the IGA 18-Hole Course of the Year. Having been appointed the Director of Culture & Recreation almost four years ago, my scope of supervision not only included the Children's Museum, but also Parks & Recreation and Palmer Hills Golf Course. At that time, I knew very little about golf course operations and maintenance. However, what I have learned in the last four years is remarkable. Not only is Palmer Hills a premier destination for golfers, but it also connects the community, preserves the environment, and provides outreach and collaboration with our local schools.

Although I do not play golf, I have been told the course is the best public course in the Quad City region. In the summer of 2023, the course logged over 40,000 rounds for the first time ever! Our Golf Maintenance Supervisor takes pride in keeping the course in great condition. Recently, our team has implemented a biological pond management program. Microorganisms are used to control algae growth in the ponds by feeding on the nutrients in the pond and starving the algae to minimize or eliminate its growth. In conjunction with this program, our team worked with Bettendorf High School's Environmental Science class, tasking them to prepare solutions to this issue. The 10-student class visited Palmer Hills, toured multiple areas and engaged in discussion about the problems of protecting our environment. The students returned to the golf course to implement their solutions as a class project.

Our maintenance team has transplanted over 300 native plants in creek banks and in landscape beds to provide more pollinator habitat, visual appeal and erosion control. We have been raising sprinklers around greens for better efficacy and playability. We use a long duration fertilizer that slowly releases nutrients to the plant and is coated with an insecticide for grubs and a crabgrass preventer. Spot spraying is more time consuming than wide area spraying but is more environmentally friendly in that we use a fraction of the amount of chemical.

Palmer Hills has also become members of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program for golf. We will be working to become certified over the next two years. Currently, only six golf courses in the state of lowa are certified. The ACSP is an environmental education and certification program that helps golf courses protect the environment, preserve the natural heritage of the game of golf, and promote environmental sustainability.

Palmer Hills also has a commitment to our community. For the past two years we have partnered with a local nonprofit organization, Tapestry Farms, helping to grow food for distribution in our community. In total, seven-hundred cabbages were planted at Palmer Hills! They were harvested, then distributed to local food pantries through an initiative that compensates primarily socially disadvantaged farmers' markets and provides work for newly arrived refugees.

In the programming realm, Palmer Hills offers clinics and leagues for men, women, and youth, including a "Girl Power" clinic to inspire young women to pursue the sport.

The Forge putting course is a unique 18 hole putting adventure designed for all abilities to play. Families, seniors, adults, and teens can play to try golf for the first time, improve their putting skills, or enjoy a more relaxed, shortened golf experience.

Palmer Grill offers daily lunch specials, event and party space, and is open to the public seven days per week.

In conclusion, I believe our team and Golf Course are well deserving of the IGA 18-Hole Golf Course of the Year. Not only is it meticulously maintained, but also provides a top-notch golf experience for all, as well as learning opportunities and partnerships in the community. I appreciate your consideration of Palmer Hills Golf Course in Bettendorf, lowa for this award.

For what you get here at Palmer Hills, the value for money is exceptional, with regular guests from areas as far away as Chicago, IL. They come from afar and visit Palmer not only for the great course conditions but also for Palmer Hill's terrific value for a round of golf.

Innovative Features: Palmer Hills is not just a golf course but a place for families and community groups to come together and enjoy the game. The award-winning 'The Forge' is a unique 18-hole putting experience that challenges and entertains golfers of all levels. - As the popularity of the course has increased including many outings, Jon finds creative ways to keep the pass holders happy while generating the extra revenue that outings provide. Somehow, he always conveys that each person's satisfaction is important to him, even when the interests of different groups conflict.
- In 2023 Palmer Hills set a record for the number of rounds played. I'm confident that Jon's efforts were a major factor in that milestone.

Brian Hickey – Course Superintendent:

- Arrived at Palmer Hills 5 or 6 years ago with training from Iowa State, and course experience in the Pacific Northwest. His changes in turf and course maintenance strategies have resulted in a significant improvement in course conditions.
